Standard Deviation- A measurement of dispersion about an average, depicting how widely a stock or portfolio's returns varied over a certain period of time. Used by investors to try to predict the range of returns that is most likely for a given investment. When an investment or portfolio has a high standard deviation, the predicted range of performance is wide, and implies greater volatility. Beta-The measure of an asset or portfolio's sensitivity to the market as a whole. A beta of 1.10 shows that the asset or portfolio has performed 10% better than its benchmark in up markets and 10% worse in down markets, assuming all other factors remain constant. Conversely, a beta of 0.85 indicates that the asset or portfolio's excess return is expected to perform 15% worse than the benchmark's excess return during up markets and 15% better during down markets. Beta performance is since inception of the managed account. The Conservative Growth model is designed for the conservative investor that seeks to provide some stability of principal while still allowing for some growth potential. The majority of the portfolio is typically invested in bonds and cash & equivalents with a smaller amount dedicated to equities. This portfolio is appropriate for those who value stability over higher returns over the long term. The Moderate Growth model is designed for the client who places a larger emphasis on growth but still requires some downside protection. The strong commitment to fixed-income investments provides some current income while also helping to stabilize the portfolio from large fluctuations in value. The Aggressive model is for the more aggressive investor who, while seeking capital appreciation, still desires the reduced risk levels that a globally diversified portfolio can provide. The majority of assets are invested in equities, with a portion placed in fixed-income investments to help temper the risk.
